

BADGES

All persons attending must wear badges and ribbons to be admitted to all the programs. Write your WBCCI number on the back of your ribbon so, if lost, and some are at every rally, it can be returned.

CONCESSION STAND

Concession Stand Food will be available from Slim's Concessions located on Midway Ave. (just down from the Family Living Building) starting June 25th through July 3rd. Service daily from 11:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.

FRIENDSHIP CENTER

The **Friendship Center** is located in the **Dakota Flavor Building** at the rear with the door at the side. Please note that activities in the WBCCI Friendship Center area will be closed during the evening programs, Opening Ceremony and Region Luncheons.

HEARING IMPAIRED

Arrangements have been made to assist any of our hearing impaired members during the evening programs. Ask the Usherettes for assistance.

MAIL SERVICE

The **Post Office is** located in the **Expo Center**. Delivery will start on June 17th, 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., weekdays. **The last mail call will be July 3rd, from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.** There is no mail delivery on July 4th.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

Medical Information is located in the **Vendor Area**. Medical Technicians will be available for blood pressure readings and referrals. No <u>medication</u> or <u>treatment</u> is available or allowed to be administered to rally participants. The address for the hospital is listed in the back of this booklet.

PET OWNERS

Pet owners are reminded that all pets must be on a leash when outside your Airstream and to <u>always clean up after your pet</u>. **PETS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN ANY BUILDING,** except during the pet show. Pet owners need to contact a local veterinarian for all services.

PROGRAMS AND SCHEDULES

Scheduled activities for special groups that are not in the program booklet may be obtained at the sign-up tables. Any program or schedule change will be posted on the **Bulletin Boards** in the **Expo Center**. Changes will also be announced at Evening Programs.

PROPANE

Propane will <u>not</u> be sold at the Rally parking site. However, commercial vendors are available nearby.

SHELTERS

There are **2 Picnic Shelters** located in the **Main Fairgrounds** that will be used as tents. To reserve a shelter space you must contact the Space Coordinator in the Women's Building. Reservations are required for use of the shelters.

RALLY COMPETITIVE EVENTS

Sign-up tables, for a wide variety of activities, are located in **Family Living.** Visit the area after registering and sign-up for your favorites, such as Region luncheons, commercial tours, flea market tables, indoor games, contests, National caravans and rallies, and other events. Stroll by the tables to be sure you have signed up and note the time and place the activities will be held.

RECYCLING

While in Huron at the International Rally, members will be able to recycle. Containers will be available on site and material may be co-mingled in one container. Aluminum will have a separate container. <u>Regular garbage including glass should be put in the regular garbage containers.</u>

TABLES & CHAIRS AND SOUND SYSTEM

<u>All Chairmen</u> giving a seminar or needing a room should contact the **Tables & Chairs Chairman** to make arrangements for room set-up. Any Chairman needing a sound system must contact the **Sound Chairman** at least 24 hours in advance.

VIDEOTAPING OF PROGRAMS

Many programs at the International Rally permit taping, but some do not want videos taken. Almost without exception PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMS will not permit their program to be taped. If you want to tape a program, check with the Entertainment Receptionist Chairman and get permission ahead of time to avoid any embarrassment.



SEVERE WEATHER - Huron, SD (Beadle County)

- 1. Severe weather in Huron can consist of <u>Severe Thunderstorm Watch/</u> <u>Warning</u>, which could involve large hail, rain, and high winds.
- 2. Tornado Watch means conditions are right for a tornado.
- 3. Tornado Warning means a tornado has been spotted or has been indicated by radar. Tornado warning sirens will sound any time day or night, if a tornado has been spotted or indicated by radar within ten miles of Huron moving in any direction. Sirens will also sound if there are severe thunderstorms or winds of 70 miles per hour or greater. You should immediately take cover at a designated storm shelter. (SD Army National Guard Armory, Family Living Center, and Women's Building) The all clear indication will be when the sirens cease.
- 4. Your best source of information will be your weather radio and the local radio stations at AM Radio 1210 KOKK, 1340 KUV, FM Radio 93.3 KRJV, 105.1 KZKK, and local TV stations 3, 5, & 9.
- 5. It is recommended that you secure awnings, flags, and all loose items AROUND your RV anytime there is a chance of bad weather and BEFORE you leave your RV.
- 6. Pets may be taken to the storm shelter, but you must be prepared to accommodate their needs.
- 7. EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION BY TEXT or E-MAIL ON YOUR CELL PHONE. TEXT: 57350 OR GO TO THE WEBSITE www.beadle.sdcounties.org. TO ACTIVATE click on www.nixle.com. This is a free service provided by the Beadle County Sheriff's Office. Charges may apply depending on your cell phone service.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.

- 1. In case of an emergency, please call 911 and then do the following:
 - a. Give your name and location, (fairgrounds, pedestal number, and your WBCCI number).
 - b. Turn on your vehicle lights, emergency flashers, and have a neighbor stand by to direct the emergency personnel to your location.
- 2. The Emergency Personnel will have a map of the fairgrounds campground which will show them your location.
- 3. YOUR **RV NUMBER** MUST BE PROMINENTLY DISPLAYED ON THE FRONT AND REAR OF YOUR RV SO EMERGENCY PERSONNEL CAN LOCATE YOU AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.

EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBERS

Directions: from Gate 3, go east on 3rd Street. Turn right (South) on Dakota Avenue. Turn left on 4th Street. HRMC emergency room is located at 174 4th Street SE. Follow the signs to the east entrance of the main hospital building.

HANDICAP PARKING

- Handicap parking spaces are available for Handicap Persons ONLY with valid Handicap Parking license plates, or stickers that are prominently displayed on the windshield or dash.
- 2. The Sheriff's Department will be patrolling the area and will issue citations for illegal parking.

SECURITY

- 1. The local Police provide officers to patrol the fairgrounds to assure compliance with all laws of the State.
- 2. It is still recommended that you keep all RV doors, compartments, and vehicles locked when not in use.
- 3. Additionally, keep all bicycles, scooters, etc., locked when not in use.
- 4. Compliance with the above guidelines will be most critical during the weekends (Grandstand Races) and the 4th of July.
